New Scout information

Welcome to Troop 110! We are glad you are here. I hope the following information will help answer some of the questions you may have about the policies and procedures of the Troop. For full information please read the Troop manual at Troop110.net

I

Outdoor Activities:

For each campout and or activity we will provide a “sign-up sheet”, **two weeks** prior to the event. At this time the Senior Patrol Leader will begin to form the Scouts into camping patrols. (Most of the time a full existing patrol will not all camp, so the boys are divided into a camping patrol). We must have as accurate a head count as possible as we determine necessary leadership, vehicles, campground fees and camp sites, and BSA tour permits.

One week prior to the event each Scout will need to pay their “grub fee” to the selected Grub Master for each patrol. This fee usually is \$10 per Scout. The Grub Master is responsible for creating the menu with his patrol and purchasing the items for all meals. (To include appropriate fuel). If a Scout has paid a fee but is unable to attend the campout, that fee will not be refunded. A Scout will not be allowed to sign up for an event after this time.

Signed Permission

Each Parent will need to sign a permission sheet before departure on all Outdoor Activities.

Departure Time

Scouts meet at 5:00pm on Fridays at the Church before each campout. Departure time is usually at 5:30. It is important that each Scout check-in with the Senior Patrol Leader and provide assistance in loading the Troop Equipment required for the outing. We travel in our Field Uniform (Khaki shirt). Each Patrol will usually make a “Brown Bag” meal on Friday nights. The Buddy System is in effect for the duration of the outing.

Suggested Items

Each Scout should bring the following items to the camp-out:

Uniform

Handbook

Compass

Sleeping bag

Pad

Canteen/water bottle (full)

Pocket knife (no sheath knives)

Day pack

Flashlight

Hygiene items (toothbrush, soap, towel, etc..)

First aid kit (completed during First Aid Merit Badge)

Poncho/rain gear

Change of clothes

Appropriate clothing for weather conditions

Tent (Troop tents are available)

Additional items: note pad, Bible, Hiking stick

Prohibited items

Fireworks

Firearms

Water pistols

Sheath knives

Personal electronics/video games, ipods, radios

Phone (cell phones are considered a safety item in camp, and are to be used only in the event of an emergency. Adults should use phone away from the boys)

Tobacco

Alcohol

Inappropriate reading material

Parents are encouraged to join the Chiefs Patrol. It is recommended that adults set the example and wear the uniform and participate fully in all of our activities.
